

★ FAMILY AFFORDABILITY FUND UPDATE & SCHOOL FEES

The B.C. Ministry of Education and Child Care has discontinued the "one-time" Student and Family Affordability Fund, which previously helped schools offset some school-related costs for families (e.g., supplies, field trips, extracurriculars).

In Central Okanagan Public Schools, no student will be denied participation in an educational program due to financial need. Our Board's Regulation 425R – School Fees (Financial Hardship Clause) ensures families can confidentially request support or alternative arrangements. If cost is a barrier for your child, please contact the school principal.

- * ATTENDANCE REPORTING: Due to the increased student population we are encouraging families to use the SchoolMessenger App or SchooMessenger Parent Portal to report your student's absence. If you choose to phone the school number, press "1" to reach the attendance line, or your call will be transferred to this line. Please refer to the email message that was sent out to all families on September 22 with steps on how to set up the School Messenger App or log into the School Messenger Parent Portal. - ★ <u>STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE</u>: Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expenses for student injuries that occur on school grounds or during school activities. Parents and guardians can voluntarily purchase private accident insurance. <u>Student Accident Insurance by StudyInsured</u> is a voluntary plan that provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses, and critical illness. - ★ The R Café is run by Culinary Arts students in grade 10, 11 and 12 under the direction of Culinary Arts teacher Elizabeth Van Dyk and Red Seal Chef Marc Schoene. The Café is opening on October 1, 2025 and will be running throughout the year from Tuesday to Friday. (It is closed on Tuesdays after a holiday Monday and for 2 weeks at the beginning of semester 2.)

 - 10:15 am 10:25 am (morning break)
 - 11:40 am 12:30 pm (lunch)
- Baked goods, bagels, fresh fruit cups, yogurt parfaits and beverages are sold before school. During the morning break, eggers, veggie plates, sandwiches and more baked goods are added to the menu. Every lunch hour the café also offers an entrée, soup, salads, paninis, burgers, fries, sub station and much more! The R Café accepts cash, debit, credit, or prepaid \$20 punch cards which are available for purchase from the office or the café.

Subject: Public Health Nurse Wellness Clinics in School Settings for Grade 10, 11, 12 Students

To students & their parents, guardians, or representatives:

As part of Interior Health (IH) - Central Okanagan's efforts to provide access to public health nursing (PHN) support and services, IH has been offering in-school PHN Wellness Clinics for grade 10, 11, and 12 students and these clinics will continue until the end of the school year.

At the Wellness Clinics in the school, Public Health Nurses will be available to talk with students and answer any questions about public health nursing services, such as health and wellness promotion/disease prevention information, and resources. This is also a great opportunity for senior high school students to meet with a public health nurse to assess their immunization history and ensure they have all the necessary vaccinations before they graduate. Some post-secondary schools/training programs require immunization history prior to starting the program.

Additionally, based on information gleaned from the recent 2023 McCreary Adolescent Survey indicating a growing concern from students regarding a variety of health-related topics, these in-school clinics will offer improved access for students to reach out to a health professional.

Checking immunization status:

Students and parents/guardians are encouraged to review their own immunization status. HealthGateway provides secure access to health records, including immunizations. Please visit:


